THE GERALD BOYLE MEMORIAL. GRADUATE STUDENT AWARD IN ECONOMIC
Open to Economics PhD students

This award is made possible by an endowment by XX. The Gerald Boyle Award is given to deserving graduate students who are successfully pursuing a course of study in Economics that includes a field in Public Finance. The award provides up to two 10-hour GA-ships for PhD students whose specialty areas include a field in Public Finance. The support is intended to help students make significant progress on a field paper or dissertation chapter for one semester during the 2016-17 academic year.

Requirements: The Boyle Award requires the submission of a 2-page summary of the research you plan to carry out next year for your field paper or dissertation chapter.

THE J. RAYMOND STUART AWARD IN ECONOMICS
Open to undergraduate and Graduate Economics Students

This award is made possible by an endowment by J. Raymond Stuart, UNM class of 1932. The award is designed to provide deserving undergraduate or graduate students with financial assistance for specific expenses related to their professional development such as the purchase of otherwise unavailable data sets, subject fees for experiments, travel to professional meetings, or other purposes necessary for professional development. The Department is accepting applications for awards of up to \$1000.

Requirements: The J. Raymond Stuart Award requires the submission of a 1-page summary of your research or other scholarly activity.

THE JULIAN S. DUNCAN SCHOLARSHIP IN LATIN AMERICAN ECONOMIC STUDIES
Undergraduate and Graduate Economics Students & MALAS Graduate Students with concentrations in Latin American Studies Economics

THE ALFRED L. PARKER, PH.D. ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN ECONOMICS
Open to Graduate Economics Students

The Alfred L. Parker Award is given to deserving graduate students who are successfully pursuing a course of study in Economics to provide them with general scholarship support. Awards of up to two scholarships of \$450 are available for graduate students to defray expenses related to research or other scholarly activities.

Requirements: The Alfred L. Parker Award requires the submission of a 1-page summary of your research or other scholarly activity and a 1-page budget, including budget justification.

 - Please ask your recommender to submit the recommendation directly to Mary Garcia, either in person or by email.
- ✓ A brief description of your financial need, including how this award will make a difference to your studies (Only required if applying for Alfred Parker)
 - No more than 1 page.
- ✓ Recipients will need to write a short summary of what they accomplished to be returned to the Department of Economics by **April 1, 2018 via email to econgrad@unm.edu.**
