

The Julian S. Duncan Scholarship in Latin American Economic Studies
*Open to UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE ECONOMICS STUDENTS and
MALAS STUDENTS with concentrations in Economics for the 2024–2025 ACADEMIC YEAR*

Application Deadline: February 19, 2024
(Incomplete or late applications will not be considered)

The Memorial Minute Adopted by the University of New Mexico Faculty, May 14, 1963, remembers Dr. Duncan in the following way: Julian S. Duncan, a former faculty member and chair of the Department of Economics at UNM, is remembered as “much more than an economist and teacher. He was a warm and sympathetic person who took upon his own shoulders many problems of his colleagues and students; several students would not have graduated had it not been for his encouragement and assistance. Beneath an unpretentious demeanor lay a firm resolve to do what was right and to lend what assistance he could.” The Department is now accepting applications for one scholarship of **\$1,000**, which will be awarded to a promising student with interests in the **economic development of Latin America**.

- Provide a current CV and unofficial transcript
- Your major advisor or a faculty member must fill out a recommendation form by **Friday, March 8, 2024** (a link to the form will be emailed to your advisor after the application is submitted)

The recipient must provide a written update at the end of the fellowship detailing the progress made from the award. They are also required to write a thank you letter to the donor’s family at the time of receiving the award. The letter will be provided to the Department of Economics and then forwarded to the donor’s family.
