LOBOTRAX AUDIT

University Requirements:

- A&S pre-admission requirements
- Admitted to your Major (congratulations!)
- 120 hours minimum
- Residency
 - 30 hrs minimum @ UNM, 15 of those hrs after 92
 - 50% of major completed at UNM
 - 25% of minor completed at UNM

YES, YOU NEED A MINOR OR 2ND MAJOR




LOBOTRAX AUDIT

University Requirements Continued:

- 2.0 GPA (Over 3.0 if considering grad school)
- English 120 (or equivalent)
- Core Curriculum
 - Must complete all 7 areas
 - C or better (not C-)
 - Specific courses only (List)

LOBO TRAX AUDIT

College Requirements:

- 96 A&S hours – need to watch electives if minoring outside A&S
 - 48 hrs 300+
 - 4th semester of a foreign language = 6hrs toward upper division
 - A&S 120
 - Could be different than University 120
 - Limited hours in certain courses
 - PE-NP (4)
 - Ensemble Music/Dance (4)
 - A&S Residency (6 hrs)

ECON MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

Needs: 33 Hours

(not including STAT145, MATH180 or 162)

1) The following Economics core courses required:

ECON 105, 106, 300, 303, 309

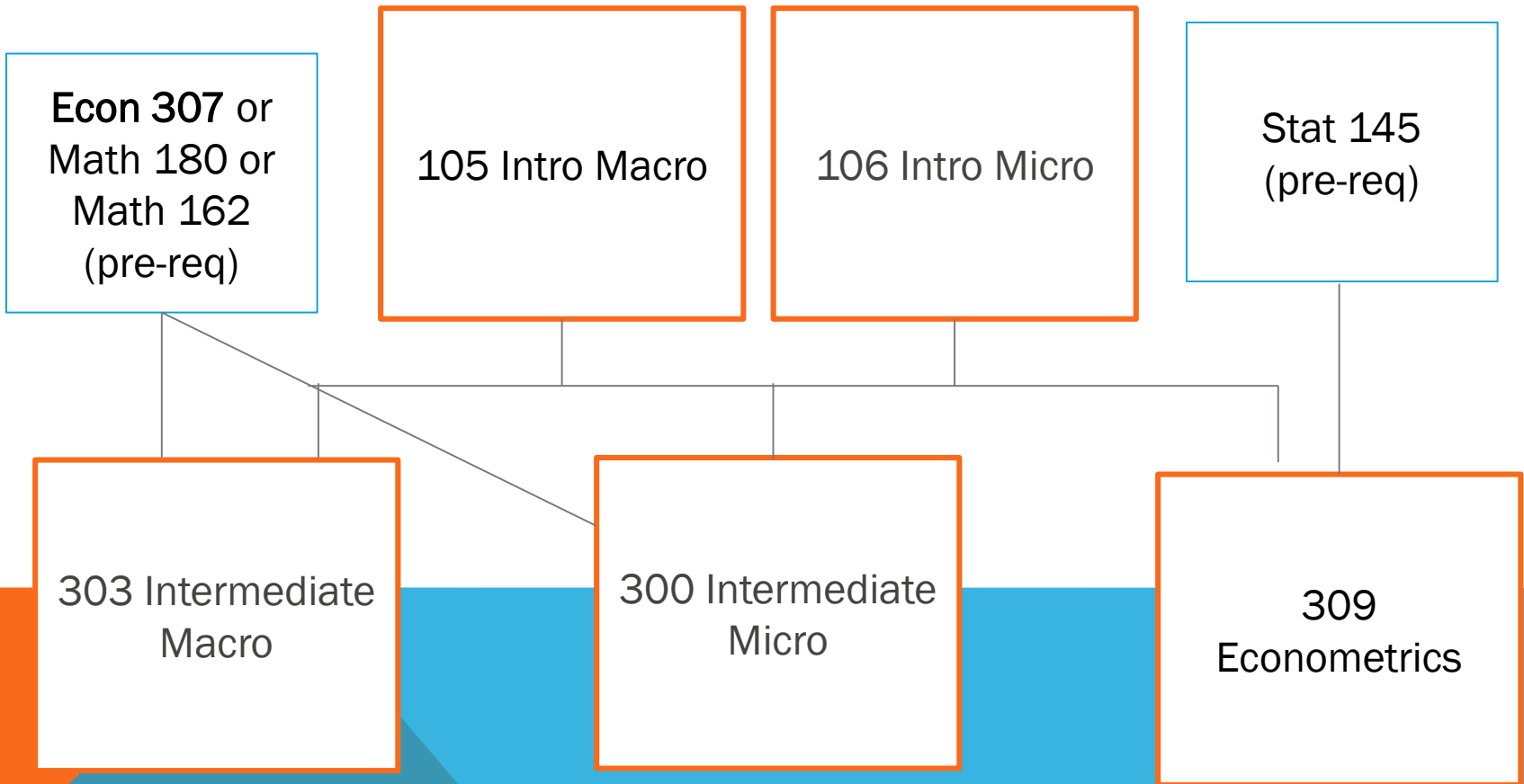
2) 3 Hours minimum from the following 400 level courses:

ECON 403, 407, 408, 409, 410, 421, 423,
424, 427, 429, 442, 445, 466, 478

3) 15 Hours of ECON Electives – with a maximum of 3 Hours from the 200 level

ECONOMICS: REQUIRED COURSES

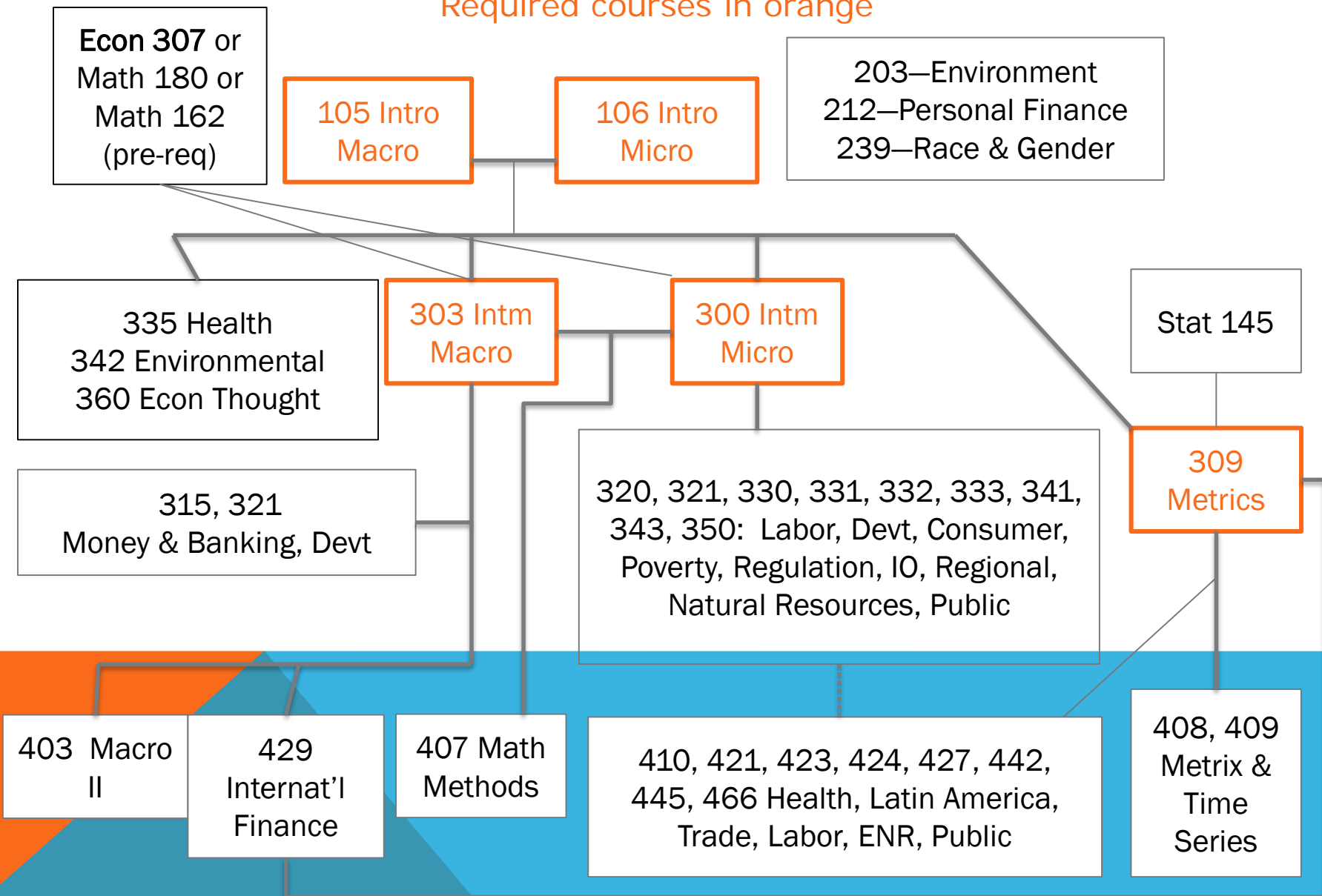
Require Courses in Orange Boxes,

THE 400 LEVEL COURSE

- Pre-requisites vary. All require at least 300 or 303 or 309 (or a combination of these)
 - Must take at least one
 - Advanced Material, Projects, Writing
 - Capstone Experience
 - Higher order thinking, problem solving

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Economics 451 with Faculty Sponsor

- Does not count for 400 level course requirement
- Can count in major electives
- 1-3 Credits, depending on hours worked for organization
- Pre-Reqs: 300, 303, 309


Economics majors are encouraged to participate in internships with private firms, non-profit organizations and government agencies. An internship provides students with practical experience and the opportunity to apply economics concepts and skills to real world problems.

Students are responsible for finding their own placements and prior approval from the Undergraduate Director/faculty is necessary before registering for the course.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Depends on how many credit hours you are earning
- Faculty with whom you are working will outline requirements

DEPARTMENTAL HONORS:

- 3.2 Overall GPA (not just in the major)
 - Faculty Sponsor
 - Two semester Sequence *in addition to 33 hour major requirements*
 - Econ 498 Reading for Honors (3 credit hours)
 - Econ 499 Honors Thesis (4 credit hours)
