Award for the Study of Economics**

Open to UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE STUDENTS for the 2020-2021 academic year

Application Deadline: March 23, 2020

(Incomplete or late applications will not be considered)

This award is made possible by an endowment from J. Raymond Stuart, UNM class of 1932. The award is designed to provide a deserving undergraduate or graduate student with financial assistance for specific expenses related to their professional development such as the purchase of otherwise unavailable data sets, subject fees for experiments, travel to professional meetings, or other purposes necessary for professional development. One award of up to \$500 to support scholarly activities is available for a graduate student to defray expenses related to research or other scholarly activities.

Please submit your application packet as a single pdf file to econgrad@unm.edu no later than close of business day Monday, March 23, 2020. If you have questions please contact your advisor.

Application Packet Must Include (in order):

- **Cover page, which includes:**
 - Name
 - Student ID Number
 - Total Hours of course work completed and current GPA
 - Degree Sought
 - Major and Minor Study Areas
 - Intended Graduation Date
 - Graduate Student Advisement Committee (e.g., Committee on Studies, Dissertation Committee, or Thesis Committee), or
 - Undergraduate Advisor
- Two page essay detailing your proposal and how this scholarship will be utilized
- A detailed budget and budget justification (for example, if used for travel, where and for what is the travel?)
- Brief explanation of your financial need and how receipt of the scholarship will enhance your education (less than one-page)
- Current unofficial transcript
- Current CV (resume)

In addition to the above application, please have your major advisor provide a letter of support directly to econgrad@unm.edu by the application deadline.

The recipient of the Stuart Award will be notified by April 6, 2020.

Please note the recipient of the Stuart Award will attend the Departmental Convocation on May 15, 2020 in order to receive the award in person.

Recipients are also required to provide a written update at the end of the fellowship detailing the results from the award. They are also required to write a thank you letter to the donor's family. The thank you letter will be collected by the Department of Economics.
