Curriculum Development or Teaching Administrative Positions

1. Econometrics Committee: we meet twice each year to discuss the graduate econometrics sequence and plan the course material – usually immediately before classes start each semester. I develop my syllabus in line with these discussions. Each year the department has changed the math boot camp and last year we added an online pre-boot camp mathematics refresher that included some statistics. This allowed me to add more probability theory and computer lab components to my course. This allows the professor for the next course in the sequence to assume a higher level of Stata (statistical analysis software package) skills and adjust his/her course accordingly.
2. Combined BA/MD Health, Medicine, and Human Values committee (HMHV), the committee on Curriculum and Student Progress (CCSP), and the Eligibility and Professionalism subcommittee (E&P): the HMHV and CCSP committees meet twice per semester to review and improve the program. The E&P committee meets as needed (6-8/year) to review student performance and professionalism violations.
3. First Semester PhD Course Instructor Group: we developed a new 8-week course schedule in 2013. We are currently using it for the second time. New PhD students take two 8-week courses each half of the fall semester – as opposed to four 16-week courses. After the initial meeting, I did some research on the learning outcomes for shorter, more intensive courses in economics and presented those findings at a faculty meeting.
4. Public Economics Field Group: we developed a new set of field requirements to better reflect the expertise of the department and make clear to prospective PhD students why our department is a good choice if their interests lie in the public economics area. I wrote the first draft of the new field requirements and was the final reviewer of the new requirements for the coordinator of graduate programs.
